## Ann Arbor Book Trivia Answer

University Cellar was established as a non-profit bookstore in 1969. It had a unique organizational structure that among other things, included the best starting wage and highest non-management base pay of any bookstore in town, and gave employees a lot of say in how the bookstore was run. It was supportive of nontraditional lifestyles and parents felt comfortable bringing their children to work during their shifts. A two-thirds majority of employees voted to join Industrial Workers of the World (IWW) in
