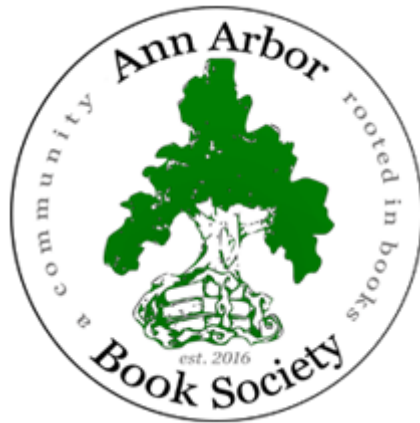

Wahr's Bookstore - Ann Arbor's Longest Lasting Bookshop

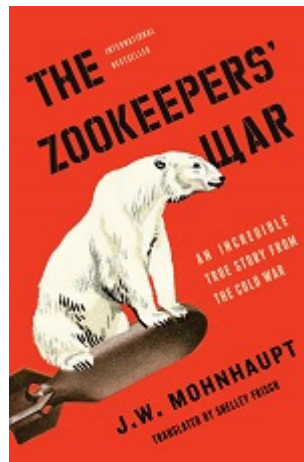
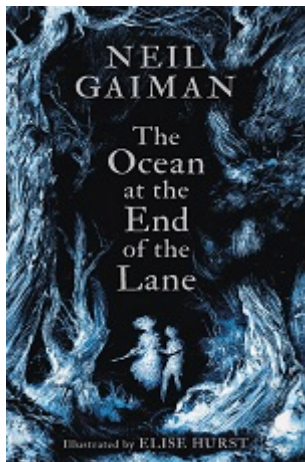

Kerrytown BookFest is a one-day festival of books and book arts, held on a Sunday each fall in the Kerrytown Farmers Market space.

Chair of Operations:

This person is responsible for the “bones” of the bookfest -- that is, the physical space where the festival takes place, along with our rights to use that space and furnish it with any needed equipment. Responsibilities include arranging for permits, insurance, equipment rental, and any requirements that might arise or

change with regard to the above.

Fundraising Chair

This person will oversee all fundraising for the bookfest, including grants and donations.

Treasurer/Chair of Finance

You do not need to be an accountant or anything like that to do this! A willingness to work with spreadsheets and attention to detail are all that is really required. Responsibilities include keeping track of the festival budget and checking account, sending necessary records to granting institutions, paying bills as needed, tracking payment of fees from vendors, and submitting records to our accountant for tax purposes.

Secretary

This person would take notes of all meetings, distribute meeting minutes to all chairpeople via email, and communicate time and place of upcoming meetings.
