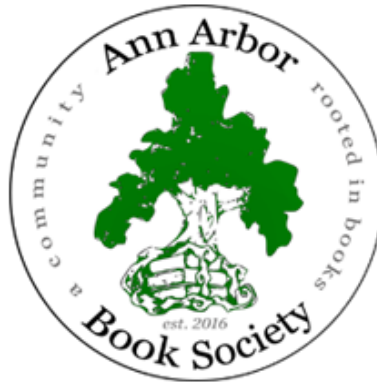

Bookstore Road Trip!

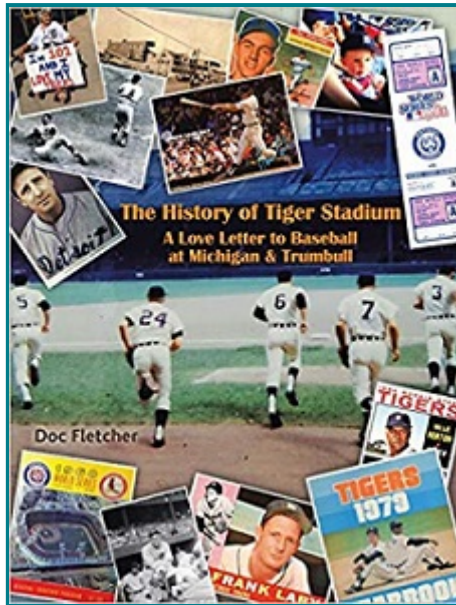

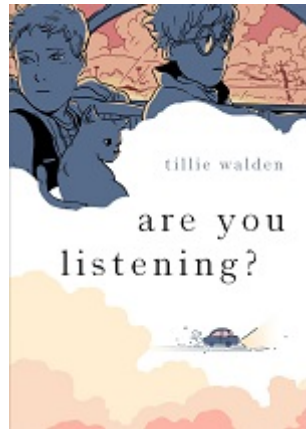
